It has been a very different process, no music, no dancing, just lots of words, words, words. Quite a big challenge for a small cast, but I am very proud of them all.

Our December show is a musical called *Olivia*, a female version of *Oliver* where you will meet many other characters along the way.

Preview evening for this production is on Tuesday 9th July 2019 at Quaker Hall, Beccles at 7.30pm where new members will be given a warm welcome.

Show Synopsis

Set in 1971, a young bride who lives above a bank with her husband, who is the Assistant Manager, innocently sends a mail order off for some Scandinavian glassware. What comes is Scandinavian pornography. The plot revolves around what is to be done with the veritable floods of elicit materials, photographs, books, films and eventually girls, that threaten to engulf this happy couple. The matter is considerably complicated by the man's Mother, his boss, a visiting bank inspector, a police superintendent and a muddled friend who does everything wrong in his



reluctant efforts to set everything right, all of which works up to a hilarious ending.

The Shows... who's who...

Peter Hunter Newly married and the Manager of a sub-branch of the National United Bank.

Frances Hunter Peter's newlywed wife. Wants to be the local seller of Scandinavian Glassware.

Brian Runnicles The Chief Cashier. Nervous, geeky and slightly put upon.

Eleanor Hunter Peter's Mother. She is an elegant and snobby character, and clearly resents Frances for marrying her son.

Leslie Bromhead Bank's district manager, Peter's boss. Appears at first to be an ogre, but we see him mellow a lot. He has an eye for the ladies and takes no time to start chatting up Peter's mother.

Superintendent Paul This character is the stock policeman character, but finds himself in several awkward situations.

Mr Needham A Bank Inspector. Similar to Mr Bromhead, he appears standoffish at first but he later gets into all sorts of fun.

Susan & Barbara Susan and Barbara are prostitutes sent over by the supplier as he's heard the Hunters' are not satisfied.

Delivery person Delivers the seemingly endless supply of ... erm... Scandinavian Glassware.




